- 1. Have a parent or guardian with you the entire time.
- 2. Never leave your lemonade stand without your parent or guardian coming with you.
- 3. Beware of busy streets:

Do not set up the lemonade stand on the side of a very busy street. You don't want people driving at high speeds come to a sudden stop to buy lemonade – this can cause an accident. Find a street that has a wide sidewalk and is frequented by people walking and riding bikes.

- 4. Do not stand in the roadway or dart out in front of vehicles: We know you want to get the attention of passerby's; however, you need to stay on the sidewalk and avoid standing in the road, so you don't get hit by a vehicle. Wave your sign safely away from the street and while on the sidewalk.
- Build or take a canopy to cover your stand: You will be out in the sun for a while and having a canopy will keep you shaded, preventing a sunburn. Plus, it may also prevent things, like leaves, from falling into your lemonade.
- 6. Always wash you hands with hot, soapy water before preparing and handling the lemonade.

Next, deliver to neighbors and friends. Also ask your parents to post the details on their social media pages.
- 4. GO ABOVE & BEYOND Providing great, friendly customer service is key for having a successful business. Be polite and respectful. Greet the customer as soon as they approach your lemonade stand. And ALWAYS thank the customer for his or her business
- 5. PAY YOURSELF FIRST Saving money is one of the most important things you can learn. After you have closed your stand for the day, count your money, determine your profits, and pay yourself a portion of the profits. Put your pay into a savings account, where it can earn interest and grow.
- 6. REINVEST INTO THE BUSINESS After you pay yourself, you will also want to take a portion of the profits and put back into your business. Maybe you need to print more flyers, purchase more cups and lemonade or maybe want to save up to build a bigger stand to accommodate more customers.
- 7. GIVE BACK TO YOUR COMMUNITY All great businesses contribute to improving the lives of others. Choose a local charity or special cause and donate a portion of your profit. Be sure to send a note with the money, explaining who you are, your business and why you choose this charity/cause.
- 8. HAVE FUN Most importantly, have fun providing your customers with the best lemonade and customer service!
